Nature's Peace gives smiles, gets smiles

Nature's Peace at CREW is a program immersing special needs people into nature. Frequently, they would not experience the wonders of the outdoors were it not for the CREW Trust and the CREW lands.

The program focuses on those with Alzheimer's, the visually impaired and the developmentally challenged.

Nature's Peace at CREW is a short walk of about a 1/2 mile and about 90 minutes. CREW volunteers focus on stimulating the senses of the participants by focusing on things that can be touched, smelled, seen, and heard. Along the way, memories bring smiles and laughter to the participants' faces.

If seeing the wide smile of a blind person when they smell a flower, or



hearing the laughter of an Alzheimer's patient when they recall a childhood memory, or watching mentally challenged participants telling each other stories about their wildlife encounter interests you, give George Luther (860-287-2628) a call to discuss being part of this very rewarding project.

Where to get it

Some equipment mentioned in the *On the Trails* columns is unique for the person using the equipment. Other items are good for everyone to carry.



Green Laser Pointer: Trail Stewards and group leaders can use green laser pointers to help visitors locate what the volunteer has spotted and wants to share with them.

Be sure to get a green laser pointer and one that is 50mw or larger. Those show up best in daytime. For variety and good deals, try Amazon.com or www.laserpointerpro.com.

When using, **NEVER EVER** point the laser directly on wildlife.

Instead, point it one or two feet below or to the side and then ask visitors to look above or beside the green dot.

To help visitors find the green dot, point the laser on the ground, in front of them and ask visitors to follow the dot as it moves to the location.

weather bug (radar, lightning)


The Buzzard Bulletin contains notes and information for CREW volunteers and is emailed six times a year (September, November, January, March, May, July). Dick Brewer, editor.

On the trails: What are you packing?

In addition to water and a fully charged cell phone, CREW Trust volunteers share what they like to carry when on the trails.

The first item I can think of is our *CREW Water, Nature and You* pocket naturalist guide. I refer to it as my “cheat sheet” when someone sees an animal, plant, etc. that they, or I, would like to confirm its identity.

The next item is a good pocket knife. While the times I’ve had to deploy it were few and far between, to not have it and then discover that you need it is not a good idea.



Other good items to have are a small pair of binoculars to see any problems ahead from a safe distance and first-aid supplies within reason with the primary concern being fire ant post-bite treatment.

Although not actually equipment, it would be good to install the WeatherBug app on a smart phone in order to get live weather radar and forecasts and more importantly, the nearest lightning strikes so there would be enough time to seek shelter.
